Roland Kehr Sr. -- Bradley Roland "Ed" E. Kehr Sr., 87, of Bradley, passed away Saturday (July 7, 2007) at his home from congestive heart failure. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Wednesday at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church in Kankakee. Rev. Charles Wheeler will officiate. Burial will be in St. George Cemetery. Memorials may be made to St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, where he was a member. Roland "Ed" was a self-employed building contractor for over 30 years. He and his wife are part owners of a bait company located in Brainerd, Minn. He was born Dec. 8, 1919, in Bloomington, the son of William and Clara Frank Kehr. He was a Boy Scout leader for many years and a member of the Moose Lodge for 50 years. He served during World War II in the Merchant Marines. He was a member of the Holy Name Society and usher for 40 years at his church. Family came first with Roland. He enjoyed fishing and, along with his wife, bowling, golfing and traveling to many parts of the world.
