Ronald E. Arseneau, 80, of Bourbonnais, died Friday (March 4, 2005) at his home. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Tuesday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais, where he was a member. Father Richard Pighini will officiate. 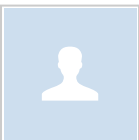
