Ronald Fitzgerald -- Manteno Ronald L. Fitzgerald, 71, of Manteno, died Tuesday (July 8, 2008) at the University of Chicago Hospital in Chicago. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Manteno, and from 10 a.m. Saturday at First Presbyterian Church in Manteno, until the 11 a.m. funeral service. Burial will be in Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery, Elwood. Mr. Fitzgerald was a conductor for Illinois Central Railroad for 44 years, and retired from Metra. He was born Aug. 25, 1936, in Clinton, the son of Ira and Hulda Ebershol Fitzgerald. He served in the U.S. Navy for six years. He was a member of First Presbyterian Church of Manteno. He enjoyed square dancing, having danced at the Illinois Veterans Home at Manteno for 10 years; camping, where he was a member of the National Railroad Campers Association (past president of NRRCA), member of the Holiday Rambler Recreation Club, chapter president of Windy City Campers Chapter 94, instrumental in starting and past president of the River Valley Ramblers Chapter 442, and past president of Country Bumpkins of Homewood. He was a 32nd Degree Mason, Bloomington Consistory, 48-year member of Dewitt Lodge 94, in Clifton and was a member of the United Transportation Union, where he served in many offices. Surviving are his wife, the former Arlene Erickson, whom he married Sept. 25, 1989, in Crown Point, Ind.; two sons, Ron Fitzgerald Jr. of Steger, Randy Fitzgerald of Matteson; one stepson and stepdaughter-in-law, Michael and Diane Garbacz of Villa Ridge, Mo.; two stepdaughters and one stepson-in-law, Kimberly Garbacz of

Salida, Colo., Debra and Dino Magdes of Dyer, Ind.; three grandchildren; two brothers and sisters-in-law, Harold and Mae Fitzgerald of Clinton, Melvin and Verna Fitzgerald of Christopher; and several nieces and nephews. His parents are deceased.
