Visitation for Rose M. Regnier, 88, of Bourbonnais, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, and from 12:30 p.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick Catholic Church, Kankakee, until the 1 p.m. celebration of the memorial Mass. The Rev. John Eck will officiate. Inurnment will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais. Memorials may be made to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. She died Thursday (July 1, 2010) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee. Mrs. Regnier was a colorist for 25 years at Blankenburg Studios. She then worked for 15 years at the Kankakee County tax office and kept the books for her husband's company, "Regnier Brothers Roofing." She was born Aug. 30, 1921, in Kankakee County, the daughter of Lida Caron LeBeau. Her husband, Russell J. Regnier, whom she married Feb. 27, 1947, at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, Kankakee, died Nov. 3, 1993. Surviving are one son and daughter-in-law, Stephen and Deborah Regnier of Rolling Meadows; three daughters and sons-in-law, Iola and Matthew Gomez of Bourbonnais, Lynne and Tom Gleeson of Centreville, Va., Karen and Michael Kern of Waukee, Iowa; and six grandchildren, Kimberley Regnier, Lindsay Regnier, Rob Kempen, Scott Gleeson, Jillian (Christopher) Havran and Zachary Kern. She was preceded in death by one grandson, Andrew Sherer; and one brother, Isidore LeBeau.
