



Sheri Ann (Schmitz) Schweizer

October 30, 1969 - September 10, 2022

BOURBONNAIS — Sheri Ann (Schmitz) Schweizer, 52, passed away peacefully in the comfort of her home with her children present on Saturday, Sept. 10.

The second of three daughters to Dick and Judy (Kvols) Schmitz, Sheri was born in Kankakee on Oct. 30, 1969.

A 1987 graduate of Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School, Sheri spent her life immersed in the community that helped raise her.

Growing up, Sheri always knew she wanted nothing more than to be a mother. In 1992, she gave birth to her first son, Mason, before giving birth to her second son, Dylan, in 1994, and her daughter and best friend, Halle, in 1999. Nothing made her more proud than her children, always cheering them on at sporting events, Scholastic Bowl, church Christmas plays and other activities. Sheri always went above and beyond for her children, but it's when she became a single mother that she truly became a source of inspiration for her family and others around her. An employee at both BSN Sports and then Walgreens for many years, many people quickly became her friend when she would greet them with a smile.

While raising her children and working full-time, Sheri earned her Associate's degree from Kankakee Community College in 2014 and her Bachelor's degree in social work from Olivet Nazarene University in 2017. Recognized by her peers as a pillar of strength and kindness, Sheri was presented with the honorary Spirit of Social Work award at Olivet in 2016.

She began her social work career at Clove Alliance (KC-CASA) as a training & anti-trafficking coordinator after her graduation from Olivet. In 2019, she became a case manager at Harbor House in Kankakee. Whether a client or coworker, everyone who met Sheri described her similarly — selfless, compassionate and thoughtful.

Sheri's positive outlook on life persisted despite living with Inclusion Body Myositis (IBM), a rare auto-immune disorder that gradually weakened her muscles over time. In June 2021, Sheri was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. In November of that year, she ended her chemotherapy battle and entered Uplifted Care (Hospice).

Despite her initial prognosis, Sheri remained as cheerful, upbeat and grateful as ever. Trusting in God's plan for her, Sheri spent her final year by writing cards and sending gifts and surprises to friends and family.

Sheri and her family were extremely grateful for the love she was shown and relationships she formed with the members of Uplifted Care, particularly her "Hospice gals."

When she wasn't getting crafty or playing card games, Sheri was glued to her TV, flipping between classic game shows, old crime dramas and sporting events.

Sheri is survived by her children, her parents and her sisters, Paula (Tony Majewski) and Angie (Jeff Benoit). She is also survived by nephews Alex Majewski and Nathan Benoit and nieces Nicole Majewski (Kevin Carlson) and Allison Benoit.

Sheri is preceded in death by maternal grandparents, Morris and Bonnie Kvols, and paternal grandparents, Henry and Lola Schmitz.

A visitation will be from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 26 at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral service will be held at Clancy-Gernon at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 27. Both are open to the public. Interment will follow at Kankakee Memorial Gardens in Aroma Township. Memorials may be made in Sheri's name to Uplifted Care Bourbonnais.

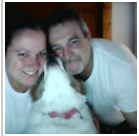

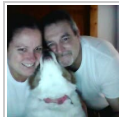
