Sister Mary Senger -- Kankakee Sister Mary Alice Senger, 96, of Kankakee, died Thursday (Nov. 30, 2006), at the sister's infirmary at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. Visitation will be from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday at Provena St. Mary's Hospital Chapel, where funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday. Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery in Beaverville. Sister Senger entered the Servants of the Holy Heart of Mary March 10, 1931 and professed her final vows Aug. 15, 1939. She was born March 28, 1910, in Danville, the daughter of Peter X. and Mary Alice McAuliffe Senger. She attended Holy Family Academy in Beaverville, was a graduate of the College of St. Francis and St. Louis University. She received her master's degree in hospital administration. She taught at Holy Family Academy from 1932-1951; was principal of St. Gall School in Chicago from 1951-1956; and worked in St. Mary's Hospital Accounting Department from 1959-1989. She was former provincial treasurer for Mercy Hospital in Champaign; board member and St. Mary's Hospital Board treasurer; and had been a provincial counselor. Surviving are several nieces, nephews and friends. One sister, Alice Fecker, is deceased.
