Stacie L. Deagan, 39, of Bourbonnais, died Sunday (July 31, 2005) at her home, after an extended illness. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee, and from 10 a.m. Wednesday at College Church of the Nazarene, University Campus, until the 11 a.m. services. “ To the family of Mrs. Deagan,

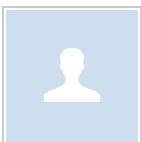

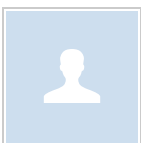
