Stanley L. Watts, 43, of Stelle, died Tuesday (Feb. 8, 2011) at the Norfolk Southern Corp. rail yard in Kankakee. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, and from 2 p.m. Saturday at the Herscher United Methodist Church, until the 3 p.m. funeral services. Pastor Scott Baird will officiate. Cremation rites will be accorded following the services. Memorials may be made to the donor's choice.

Mr. Watts worked for Norfolk Southern Railroad. He was born Jan. 1, 1968, in Chicago, the son of Stanley T. and Loretta Wall Watts. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving from 1986-1990.
