



## Theodore Nicholos

October 23, 1920 - January 22, 2005

Theodore S. "Ted" Nicholos, 84, of Kankakee, longtime local businessman and community leader, died Saturday (Jan. 22, 2005) at Northwestern Memorial Hospital in Chicago. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee, with a 7 p.m. prayer service. Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday at Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church in Kankakee. Father Andoni Calozzo and Father William Conjelko will officiate. Burial will be in Mound Grove Gardens of Memory. Memorials may be made to Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church, where he was a member. He owned and operated Ted's Shoes in the Meadowview Shopping Center for many years. He also was former president of the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church Board, former president of the Downtown Business Association, a board member of the Kankakee Development Corp., member of the City of Kankakee Planning Commission, the Kankakee river Valley Chamber of Commerce, the National Federation of Independent Businesses and a 50-year member of the organization, AHEPA. Mr. Nicholos was born Oct. 23, 1920 in Kankakee, the son of Sam and Demetra Mavroganes Nicholos. Surviving are his wife, the former Vicky Tsenes of Kankakee, whom he married March 1, 1964, at St. Nicholas Greek Church in Chicago; three sons and daughters-in-law, Sam T. and Dawn Nicholos, Andrew and Elizabeth Nicholos, and Peter and Kimberly Nicholos, all of Kankakee; six grandchildren; two sisters, Goldie Jaime of Kankakee, Betsy Osback of Bourbonnais; and one brother and sister-in-law, Nick and

Nadine Nicholos of Streamwood.Six brothers, Andrew, John, Andrea, Chris, Steve and Jim; and one grandchild are deceased.He enjoyed sports, and watching his children and grandchildren in their sports activities.
