Therese M. "Terry" Gund, age 88, of Bourbonnais, passed away Friday, February 16, 2018 at the Bickford House in Bourbonnais.

She was born July 4, 1929 in Bradley, the daughter of Harvey & Isabel Hebert Boudreau.

She married V. Paul Gund on August 11, 1951 at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Bradley.

Terry was a retired teacher at Maternity BVM. She also taught over the years at Bishop McNamara, St. Joseph Seminary, Notre Dame Academy High School, and Cardinal Stritch College in Milwaukee, WI.

She enjoyed sewing.

She was a parishioner at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, where she served as a Lector and Eucharistic Minister. She was also an active member of the CCW. Terry served on the Bourbonnais Planning Commission from 1967-2013, where she served as the Commission Secretary for the entire tenure. She was on the Administrative & Finance Committee of Maternity BVM Worship Commission and a member of the first School Board at Maternity BVM.

Surviving are her husband, Paul Gund of Bourbonnais; four sons, Gerry & Lynne Gund of Kankakee, David Gund of Cave Creek, AZ, Hank & Laura Gund of Pittsburgh, PA, and Bruce & Margene Gund of Bradley; one daughter, Jeanne & David Steinbach of Frankfort; one sister, Elaine Murphy of Pine Ridge, SD; thirteen grandchildren; and thirteen great-grandchildren.

She is preceded in death by her parents; three infant children, Richard, Raymond, and June; and one sister, Sr. Phyllis Boudreau, CND.

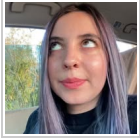

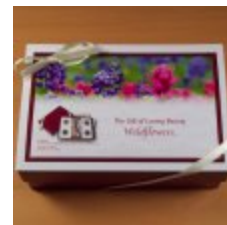
