Thomas L. Lustig, age 71, of Bradley passed away Saturday, July 16, 2022 at Porter Place Assisted Living in Tinley Park. He was born October 5, 1950 in Kankakee, the son of Joseph & Stella (Buchinski) Lustig. Thomas married Vicki Hurst. She preceded him in death on May 28, 2018.

Thomas was a retired employee of CSL Behring. He was a graduate of St. Joseph Grade School and Bradley Bourbonnais Community High School. Thomas received his associates degree from Kankakee Community College. He was a member and past commander of the Bradley American Legion Post #766 and the Bradley V.F.W. Thomas was an avid Green Bay Packer and Chicago White Sox Fan.

Thomas was a veteran of the United States Army having served during the Vietnam Conflict.
