She died Tuesday (March 21, 2006) at ManorCare Health Services in Kankakee. Mrs. Dahn was owner of Verna's Cafe in Bonfield from the 1960s to the 1970s. She was born May 17, 1925, in Bonfield, the daughter of John and Hulda Stehr Grob. Her husband, George Dahn, whom she married Feb. 18, 1944, died in 1988. She was a member of the Mary Circle at her church, the Bonfield Lioness Club, the Kankakee Woman's Club, Salina Township Sportsman's Club, Euchre Club and the 500 Club. She enjoyed bingo, playing cards, cooking, was famous for her homemade pies and loved to wear hats. Surviving are one son, Marvin Dahn of Bonfield; one daughter and son-in-law, Charlene and Benny Skeldon of Marco Island, Fla.; five grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. Two brothers, four sisters and one granddaughter are deceased.

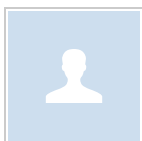
