He had also been water superintendent for the Village of St. Anne. He was born June 21, 1914, in Beaverville, the son of John and Pauline Leveque Regnier. His parents are deceased. His wife, the former Helen Marie Nourie, whom he married March 11, 1943, in Beaverville, died Jan. 12, 2005. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Terry and Vicki Regnier of Watseka, Gary and Karen Regnier of Kankakee; one brother and four sisters-in-law, Lloyd and Pearl Regnier of Sarasota, Fla., Delores Ahmann of Minneapolis, Minn., Inez Regnier and Elaine (Randy) Arseneau, both of Beaverville; five grandchildren, Scott, Margaret, Tim, Johnathan and Jennifer Regnier; and one great-granddaughter, Miranda Brook Regnier. Two sisters and three brothers-in-law, Lucille and Louie Saindon, Parmelle and Harry Laurent, Elmer Nourie Jr.; and one brother, Donald Regnier, are deceased. Mr. Regnier served in the U.S. Army during World War II. He was past commander of St. Anne American Legion Post 842. He enjoyed bowling and softball. He was a diehard Cubs fan.
