



## Virgil Bertrand

May 15, 1937 - September 24, 2009

Visitation for Virgil P. Bertrand, 72, of Manteno, will be from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Manteno. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Manteno. Burial will be in St. Joseph Cemetery, Manteno. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made for Masses or to the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. He died Thursday (Sept. 24, 2009) at Riverside Medical Center, Kankakee. Mr. Bertrand was born May 15, 1937, in Goodrich, the son of Isadore and Nora Mae Swanson Bertrand. He was married Nov. 28, 1959 to Madonna J. Nugent at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Manteno. He was a 1955 graduate of Manteno High School and was a Private First Class in the U.S. Army for four years. Mr. Bertrand retired from Commonwealth Edison Co. after 35 years of service. In retirement, he served as a village trustee for the City of Manteno and was a volunteer for Meals on Wheels. Virgil was a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church and was active as a fourth degree knight in the Knights of Columbus. Survivors include his wife; two daughters, Bridget Bertrand (Cindy Essington) of Bourbonnais, Briana Bertrand of Bradley; four sons, Bryant (Marti) Bertrand of Roscoe, Brendan Bertrand of Bradley, Brady (Amy) Bertrand of Manteno, Brodie (Rachel) Bertrand of Palatine; three brothers, Darrell (Kay) Bertrand, Kenneth (Eloise) Bertrand, both of Manteno, Ray (Karen) Bertrand of Nixa, Mo.; four sisters, MaryLou Paquette of Visalia, Calif., Patricia Salrin, Linda Blanchette and Denise Canfield, all of Manteno; and 11 grandchildren, Amanda Bertrand, Addison Bertrand, Avery Bertrand, Dane
