Visitation for Vivian E. "Viv" Lock, 90, of Kankakee, will be from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Wednesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. Graveside services, with military rites, will be held at 12:30 p.m. Wednesday at Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery, Elwood. He died Saturday (Oct. 2, 2010) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. Mr. Lock was a career military man, retiring in July 1968 from the U.S. Air Force at the rank of lieutenant colonel. He also worked for Azzarelli Construction. He was born July 13, 1920, in Kankakee, the son of Ben and Lottie Kahney Lock. His wife, the former LaVonne Guy, whom he married Aug. 17, 1952, in Streator, died May 19, 2008. He served in the U.S. Air Force during World War II, where he was a B-29 pilot flying the City of Kankakee, and was a founding member of the Vintage Squadron. He enjoyed working with horses and restoring carriages. Surviving are one son, James Lock and Kathleen Drago, of Newnan, Ga.; one daughter, Bonnie Lyons, of Riverside, Calif.; three grandchildren, Jason Lock, Kaylyn Lock and Stephanie Kenny; three great-grandchildren, Tyler, Devin and Tanner; one sister, Chrystabel Kraft; and one brother and sister-in-law, Tom and Dolores Lock, of Kankakee. His parents are deceased.

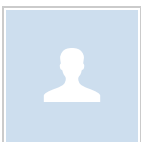
