Surviving are her husband, Harlen Windhorn of Bourbonnais, whom she married Dec. 4, 1960, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Danforth; one son and daughter-in-law, Kyle and Lisa Windhorn of Liberty Lake, Wash.; two daughters and sons-in-law, Cindy and Greg Giusto of Bourbonnais, Christy and Dave Palm of Gulf Breeze, Fla.; seven grandchildren including Alexandra, Kyle II, Hayley and Hannah Windhorn; Madeline Giusto and Twin girls Jessica and Victoria Palm; and four brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law.
