Walter Flammond -- Bradley Walter J. Flammond, 87, of Bradley, died Friday (May 5, 2006) at ManorCare Health Services, Kankakee. Visitation will be from 4-7:30 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Joseph Catholic Church, Bradley, where he was a member. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais. Memorials may be made to the Alzheimer's Association. Mr. Flammond was a U.S. Government Ammunition and Procurement Supply Officer, retiring in 1973. He was born July 27, 1918, in Winner, S.D. on the Sioux Reservation, the son of Louis P. and Corinne Janis Flammond. His first wife, the former Marjorie Whipple, whom he married in July 1936, in Rosebud, S.D., died in 1986. He was a member of the Lakota Sioux Tribe in Rosebud and served in the U.S. Army. Surviving are his wife, the former Juanita Lucas, whom he married Nov. 29, 1989, in Kankakee; four sons and daughters-in-law, Wayne and Maria Flammond of Killeen, Texas, George and Karen Flammond of Chicago, Walter and Carol Flammond of Sierra Vista, Ariz., Ronald and Rosalie Flammond of Las Vegas; two daughters and one son-in-law, Yvonne and John Tofanelli of Galt, Calif. and Phyllis Hahs Flammond of New Lenox; one stepson, Lee Hahs of McCormick, S.C.; one stepdaughter, Jeannie Banyas of Groveland, Fla.; two sisters, Rita Lyle of Springfield, Mo., Mary Ann Ford Night Pipe of Rapid City, S.D.; eight grandchildren and several great-grandchildren. Deceased are his father; his mother and stepfather, Corinne and Jake Kills-In-Sight; two brothers, George

and Lloyd Flammond; and one sister, Anita Flammond.
