



## Wanda Linskey

December 18, 1913 - November 22, 2004

Wanda M. Linskey, a lifelong resident of Kankakee County, died at the home of her son in Rockford on November 22 following a lingering illness. Born in Momence on December 18, 1913 to Joseph and Myrtle Putz, Wanda Linskey was the wife of John P. Linskey of Braidwood, who predeceased her in 1983. Mrs. Linskey had been an employee of Alden's Department Store in Kankakee until its closing in the early 1980's. Her service to Alden's spanned over 35 years and her responsibilities had included Payroll Clerk and Office Manager. Mrs. Linskey was also active with her husband in the operation of Linskey's Liquor Store, a neighborhood fixture for two decades in the 1000 block of West Station Street of Kankakee.
