Wesley Walters -- Bourbonnais Wesley L. Walters, 87, of Bourbonnais, died Wednesday (Feb. 13, 2008) at his home. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, and from 1 p.m. Saturday at Our Savior Lutheran Church, Bradley, until the 2 p.m. services. Pastor Patty Heath will officiate. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens, Aroma Township. Memorials may be made to Our Savior Lutheran Church, where he was a member, or to the donor's choice. Mr. Walters was head electrician at Shapiro Developmental Center, retiring after 29 years of service. He was born Sept. 4, 1920, in Kankakee, the son of Fred and Verda Edwards Walters. His wife, the former Nelda Meyer, whom he married April 11, 1953, in Chebanse, died Aug. 10, 2005. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army serving during World War II as a tank commander in the 745th Tank Battalion of the 1st Armored Division in Normandy and the Battle of the Bulge. He was a 60-year member of the Electrician Local 176 (IBEW). Surviving are one son and daughter-in-law, James and Ann Walters of Bonfield; one daughter and son-in-law, Janet and Scott Martin of Bourbonnais; four grandchildren, Martin Walters, Jonathan (Lori) Walters, Andy Martin, and Katie Martin; and two great-grandchildren, Miranda and Mason Walters. Deceased are his parents, two brothers, "Fat" and Jim; and one sister, Jeanne Utroska.
