September 3, 1943 - March 20, 2017

William J. "Bill" Balthun, 73, of Kankakee, passed away Monday (March 20, 2017) at his home.

He was born September 3, 1943, in Kankakee, the son of William Albert Edward and Rita Denault Balthun.

Bill began his career at 8 years old pumping gas and working with his father at the Sinclair Station on Kankakee's Southside in 1951. He continued working in gasoline, towing, and automotive services by becoming owner-operator of the Shell Station at the corner of Station and Wall. He serviced thousands of happy customers over the years, many of whom followed him to his last business endeavor at Balthun's Automotive on South Schuyler. While always focusing on his customers' automotive needs first, Bill still made time to be a longtime member of the Kankakee Valley Boat Club, Aroma Park Boat Club, The 100 Club, The ATA (Automotive Trade Association), and, respectfully, he was a Shriner. Bill also loved to hunt and fish.

Surviving are his longtime companion Jan Bolling, of Kankakee; one daughter and son-in-law, Tammy and Lance Hatting, of Kankakee; one daughter and fiancé, Donna Balthun and David McCombs, of Reno, Nevada; one grandson, Caleb Hatting, of Indianapolis, Indiana; one brother and sister-in-law, Wayne and Laura Balthun, of Canyon Lake, Texas; one nephew and his wife, William

and Amanda Balthun and their 3 children Kaylee, Weston, and Wayne and one niece, Amanda Balthun, of all Texas. Bill was also survived by many, many close friends who either did business with him, played euchre with him, dine with him, had coffee with him at work, or “sat” with him at Born’s/Smitty’s.

Preceding Bill in death were his parents.

Cremation rites have been accorded. A memorial visitation will be from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Wednesday, March 22, 2017 at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home in Kankakee.

And then once the station was closed it was off to rehab the apartments bought and sold along the "tracks" south of town.

One of the more memorable events for me involved the 1963 green Rambler that sat on the used car lot behind the Sinclair station for a couple years. It just wouldn't sell even at the low price of \$400. Bill often let me use one of the "used car fleet" when I was home from school and "car less." I was in a wedding that Saturday evening and the Rambler was the only car left on the lot and Bill said take it. On the way home the next morning around sun rise, I fell asleep and rolled the Rambler. Of course I had to call Bill to bring the tow truck to retrieve the wreck.

It sat behind the station for about a week when a guy stopped in and said, how much for the wrecked Rambler? Bill said, "What will you give me for it?" He said \$500! Bill quickly exclaimed it's yours and I'll throw in free towing.

When I came home from school the next weekend, Bill handed me a crisp \$100 and said I'm glad you didn't get hurt preparing the Rambler for sale!
