Visitation for William J. Dunlavey, 69, of Bourbonnais, will be from 5-8 p.m. Monday, with an 8 p.m. wake service, at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. Mr. Dunlavey was a retired rural mail carrier for the Bourbonnais Post Office. He was born Aug. 7, 1935, in Chicago, the son of John J. and Cecelia McMahon Dunlavey. His parents are deceased. His wife, the former Bonnie J. L'Ecuyer, whom he married Oct. 19, 1957, in Kankakee, died July 1, 1999.
