



## William Gessner

September 27, 1917 - March 10, 2005

William G. Gessner, 87, of Kankakee, died Thursday (March 10, 2005) at his home. A memorial service will be held at 3 p.m. Saturday at the Congregational United Church of Christ, Kankakee, where he was a founding member. Rev. Thomas Zimmerman will officiate. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to the Kankakee County Humane Society or to the Congregational United Church of Christ. Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee, is in charge of arrangements. Mr. Gessner was a self-employed insurance and real estate broker. He was past president of the Kankakee County Board of Realtors and was named Realtor of the Year in 1992. He was born Sept. 29, 1917, in Beaver Dam, Wis., the son of Benjamin F. and Mayme Ploof Gessner. His parents are deceased. Surviving are his wife, the former Jean Todd, of Kankakee, whom he married May 24, 1941, in Auburn; one son and daughter-in-law, Todd and Sally Gessner of Mt. Vernon; one daughter and son-in-law, Gretchen and Robert "Bevan" LaBeau of Kankakee; four grandchildren, Heather (Jason) Owens, Brant (Jamie) Gessner, K.T. and Luke LaBeau; three great-grandchildren, Hannah and Evan Owens and Ella Gessner; one nephew, Bob (Sherry) Gessner; and one niece, Barb Casey. One sister, Betty; and one brother, Robert, are deceased. He was a graduate of Knox College and a very loyal University of Illinois fan and financial booster. Mr. Gessner served in the U.S. Army Air Corps in the Pacific Theatre of Operations during World War II as a reconnaissance photographer. He was a proud member of the VFW Vintage Squadron. He was a member of

the Lions Club, where he was secretary for over 50 years; a member of the Moose, the Masonic Lodge and member and supporter of Ducks Unlimited and Northern Illinois Anglers Association. He was also a member of the City of Kankakee Zoning Board. He was an avid fisherman and photographer.
