William E. Leiser, age 83, of Bourbonnais, passed away Thursday, November 22, 2018 at his home.

Bill was born October 28, 1935 in Kankakee, the son of Mandel & Helen Doran Leiser.

He married Sharon Lanoue on October 27, 1962 in Peoria.

Bill attended Onarga Military School. He was a graduate of Herscher High School and Bradley University in Peoria.

Bill was the private investor and longtime owner of Leiser Furniture Company in Herscher. The legacy of his business continues to operate by his daughter and his daughter-in-law.

He was a member of the Army National Guard.

Bill, in his own unique way, loved watching the stock market, enjoyed photography, eating – especially ice cream, golfing in his younger years, socializing, traveling, and sharing stories with his grandchildren. He really enjoyed just being out and about, meeting his friends at Starbucks, being in the action and sharing stock tips.

Bill is preceded in death by his parents and one son, Eric Leiser.

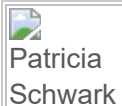

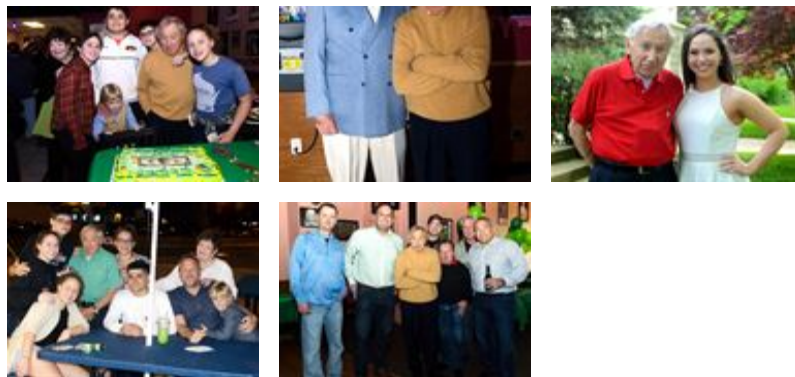
